Our guest speakers were Prof. Pam Russell and her colleague, Dr Brian Tse, from the Australian Prostate Cancer Research Centre Qld, Princess Alexandra Hospital, Brisbane. They gave a very interesting talk on the latest prostate imaging and reporting systems research developments. In particular, they spoke about the use of iron oxide and/or hyper-branched polymer nano particles to better highlight the PSMA (prostate specific membrane antigen) molecule in clinical imaging. The aim is to improve prostate cancer diagnosis and treatment by better targeting of the PSMA molecule and avoid some of the adverse side effects with the use of the nano particles.

Next month's guest speaker will be Dr Charles Chabert, a urological surgeon now located at Pindara Hospital.
