Cancer Council Queensland is Queensland's leading non-government cancer organisation that interfaces with the community. Our Mission is to lead Queenslanders in a partnership against cancer.

We bring over sixty years of experience in conducting high quality research into all cancers for all Queenslanders. We translate this research into the provision of quality care and information services to patients and their families throughout the cancer journey.

We are a not-for-profit entity, working in close alignment with a broad network of education, health philanthropic, industry and community partners. These partnerships are pivotal to the success of our new 2023-2027 strategic plan, titled "Navigating Cancer Together".

The strategy identifies three priorities which focus on Research, Prevention and Support. These key priorities will deliver evidence-based programs, which will reduce cancer risk and improve the experience and quality of life for people living with cancer.

The strategy will build on our successful track record and national reputation in the delivery of internal research projects, as well as financial support to improve the capability, education and knowledge across the sector. To achieve this impact, we will:

- Create new partnerships to improve the connectivity between research, clinical care, and patient support services to ensure timely and best practice treatment
- Partner with other cancer charities to share resources, build capacity and increase access to critical data

Cancer Council Queensland's mission has never been so vital...

More than 30,000 Queenslanders are diagnosed with cancer each year. This is expected to increase to over 40,000 new cases a year by 2030 as the population grows and ages.


At the same time, survival is improving as early detection and treatment of cancer improves, and so each year the number of people living with cancer will increase. It is estimated that approximately 350,000 Queenslanders will be living with cancer by 2030.

Research indicates:

- 1 in 2 Queenslanders will be diagnosed with cancer by the age of 85.
- Over 450,000 new diagnoses are estimated over the period 2019-30.
- Overall cancer survival is increasing whereby 5-year relative survival has increased from 53% to 72% over the last 40 years.

There is a growing demand and a continually changing need for support services.



Research

Conduct and support cancer research to improve outcomes for all people affected by cancer.

Translate evidence to practice

Improve prevention and early detection

Conduct high-quality research to understand cancer risk behaviours and barriers to change. Develop and test interventions to drive behaviour change and improve screening participation.

Understand the needs of those affected by cancer

 Conduct high-quality research to understand gaps in health and support systems, and how these can be improved to help survivors and their families to live well after cancer.

Understand the epidemiology of cancer

Conduct high-quality research to understand the epidemiology of cancer, and to map and report variations and trends in cancer outcomes and influences on a population basis.

Drive high quality research for children with cancer

Maintain a national population-based registry of childhood cancer; analyse and report national childhood cancer benchmarks; conduct high-quality research to improve outcomes for children with cancer.

Leverage cancer data

 Communicate accurate data about cancer to all stakeholders using accessible and effective communication methods to drive individual and health system change.

Support external research

Support Queensland-based cancer research, next-generation cancer researchers, and cancer clinical trials.




EQUITY AND INCLUSION
