## **CANCER IN BRISBANE**

Every year, around 12,367 people in the Greater Brisbane region are diagnosed with cancer, an average of 34 people each day. Around 3,640 people die from the disease every year.

The most common types of cancer in the region are:

- Prostate cancer
- Melanoma
- Female breast cancer
- Bowel cancer
- Lung cancer

## **FUNDRAISING**

In 2023, our Brisbane community raised \$1,482,782 to prevent cancers, find more effective treatments, and give the highest level of support to all Queenslanders touched by cancer.
