CANCER IN FAR NORTH QUEENSLAND

Every year, around 1,842 people in Far North Queensland are diagnosed with cancer, an average of 5 people each day. Around 601 people die from the disease every year.

The most common types of cancer in the region are:

- Prostate cancer
- Melanoma
- Female breast cancer
- Bowel cancer
- Lung cancer

FUNDRAISING

In 2023, our Far North Queensland community raised \$298,114 to prevent cancers, find more effective treatments, and give the highest level of support to all Queenslanders touched by cancer.
