CANCER IN WIDE BAY

Every year, around 1,980 people in the Wide Bay are diagnosed with cancer, an average of 5 people each day. Around 681 people die from the disease every year.

The most common types of cancer in the region are:

- Prostate cancer
- Melanoma
- Bowel cancer
- Female breast cancer
- Lung cancer

FUNDRAISING

In 2023, our Wide Bay community raised **\$247,132** to prevent cancers, find more effective treatments, and give the highest level of support to all Queenslanders touched by cancer.
